

Barriers to HIV Prevention and Care

- HIV testing, treatment, and prevention are often offered separately
- HIV services are not consistently incorporated into other routine healthcare
- Securing supportive services that addresses social determinants of health






Barriers to HIV Prevention and Care: Systemic Stigma

- Systemic stigma is another barrier to prevention and care
- Providers may often convey implicit biases
- Quality of care may be impacted by these biases





Identified Systemic Challenges & Structural Barriers







Status Neutral HIV Prevention and Care



People whose HIV tests are positive enter primary care and are offered effective treatment and supportive services to achieve and maintain viral



Follow CDC guidelines to test people for HIV. Regardless of HIV status, quality care is the foundation of HIV prevention and effective treatment. Both pathways provide people with the tools they need to stay healthy and stop HIV.

- Confirming diagnosis
- Linking him to a provider
- Conducting a comprehensive biopsychosocial assessment
- Securing referrals to services
- Establishing a service plan
- Continually reviewing the service plan





Kevin

- Given condoms
- Assessed for eligibility and readiness to engage in PrEP
- Given a list of PrEP providers
 One year later:
- Receives a positive result
 - Unstably housed
 - Unable to navigate community resources
 - Engaging in sex for housing









Key Elements of a Status-Neutral Approach

- Regardless of test results, clients should be fully assessed and linked to appropriate services
- Focuses on "one-door" comprehensive system of care, prevention and support services
- Modifies the traditional continuum from a condition specific approach to a holistic, needs based approach






Key Elements of a Status-Neutral Approach Continued

- Places a high priority on assessment and addressing social determinants of health
- Emphasizes the use of culturally inclusive and responsive quality care and prevention services
- Places a focus on the use of community health workers, navigators, and adherence coaches





STATUS NEUTRAL AT THE INDIVIDUAL LEVEL



Benefits of a Status Neutral Approach

- Decrease the number of new HIV infections
- Increase opportunities to maximize effectiveness in service delivery by reducing duplication in efforts
- Improvements in health equity for populations accessing these services
- Supports and enables the achievement of optimal health outcomes
- Promotes collaboration between systems and organizations






