

**Training Proposal from IPE/HIV primary care training team, College of Nursing**

Goals: The mission of the IPE/HIV project is to train health professions students and faculty on issues relevant to HIV primary care, such as chronic disease management, risk reduction, HIV testing, and comorbidities including mental health and substance use.

Timing and Format: Presentations will be scheduled for the **second Tuesday of each month** at 5:30 pm, when students gather for a short planning meeting and case-based training discussion before they begin seeing patients, and will focus on practical tips and tools. Teaching methods will include a pocket guide or reference sheet for talking points rather than PowerPoint slides, and case-based discussion.
