Fenway Health offers clinical rotations in primary care for resident physicians and students currently enrolled in a DO, MD, NP, or PA program, with priority given to students in the final year of their program. The mission of Fenway Health is to enhance the wellbeing of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community and all people in our neighborhoods and beyond through access to the highest quality health care, education, research and advocacy. Residents and students can expect to gain insights into primary care practice within a federally qualified community health center that serves a large number of LGBT patients and people with HIV/AIDS, but also serves patients from all backgrounds. We are especially interested in providing this clinical rotation opportunity to applicants who are seriously pursuing a career in primary care.

Rotations are offered during the following sessions. Maximum rotation length is four weeks.
