## ENDING THE HIV EPIDEMIC (EHE): in the United States




The goal: reduce new HIV infections in the U.S. by 75% by 2025 and by 90% by 2030



The AETC Program, funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration's HIV/AIDS Bureau, is one of several programs awarded to tailor and implement strategies to build clinician capacity to address the plan's 4 key pillars:

- Diagnose all people with HIV as early as possible.
- Prevent new HIV infections by using proven interventions, including pre- and post-exposure prophylaxis and syringe services programs.
- Treat people with HIV rapidly and effectively to achieve sustained viral suppression.
  - Respond quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get needed prevention and treatment services to people who need them.



The EHE initiative is focusing on approximately 57 jurisdictions (cities, states, and counties) where new HIV infections are most concentrated.

Each of the 8 AETC regions has at least one such jurisdiction.
