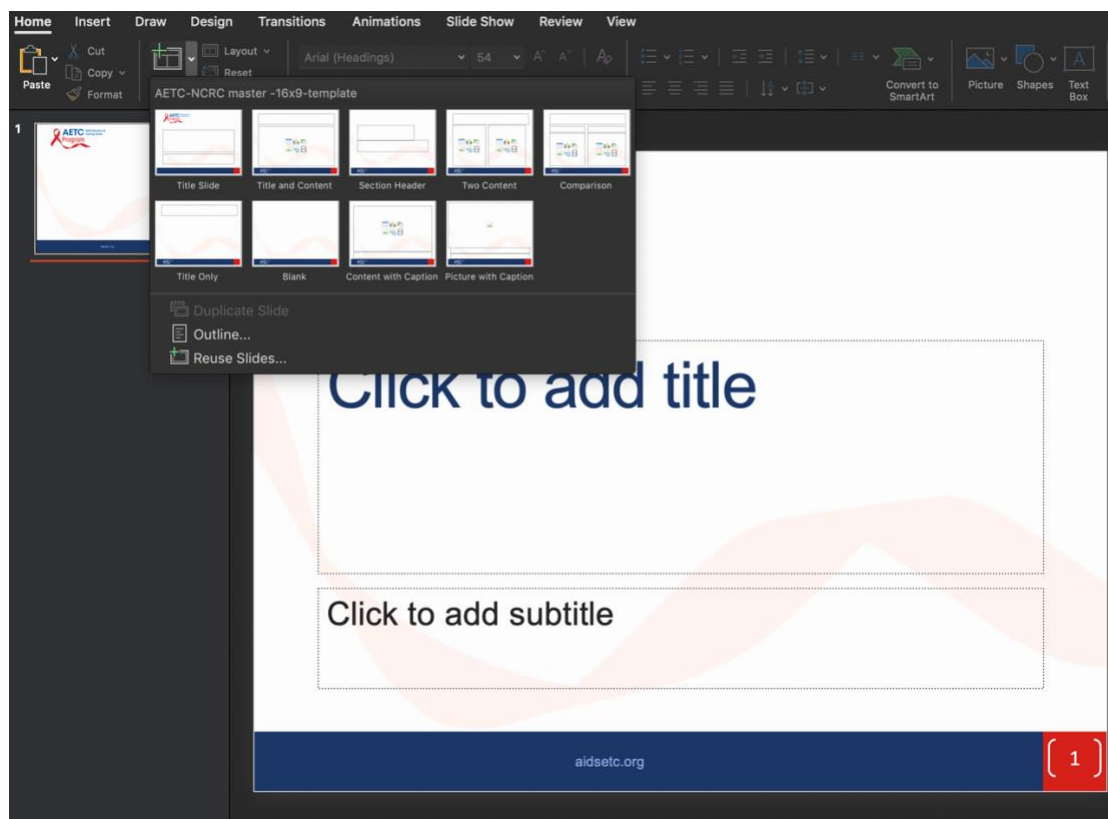

## Best Practices

### 1. Layout

- a. Use PowerPoint's standard layouts. Create your content in the placeholder provided, screen readers will follow the correct order as they advance through each slide. To choose a layout for a slide, right-click in a blank area of the slide. When the menu opens, click Layout. Every layout has a title placeholder. Give a **unique** title to each slide.



## 2. Slide Design

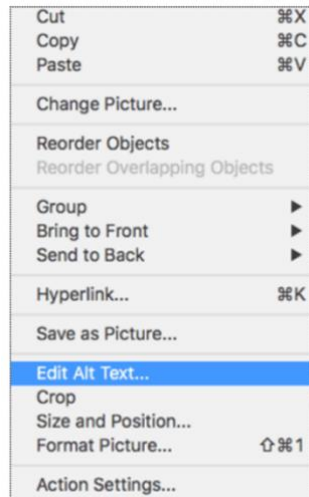
- a. Use the accessible AETC slide design provided.

## 3. Fonts

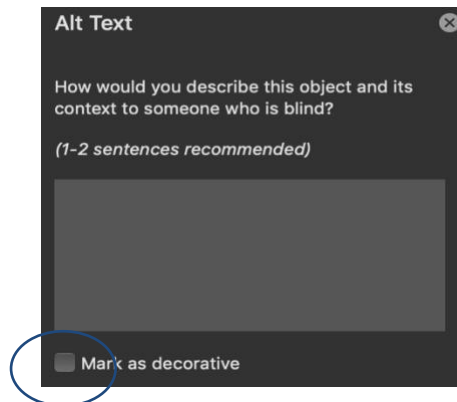
- a. Use a larger font size (18pt or larger), sans serifs fonts (i.e. Helvetica, Avant Garde, Arial, and Geneva, PT Sans Pro) and enough white space. This document is written in Arial font.

## 4. Alt Text for Images

- a. Add alternative text to **every** image, screenshot, graph etc. Right-click an image. Select **Edit Alt Text**. Type 1-2 sentences to describe the image and its context to someone who cannot see it.



- b. If the image is purely for design, then make sure to “mark as decorative.”
